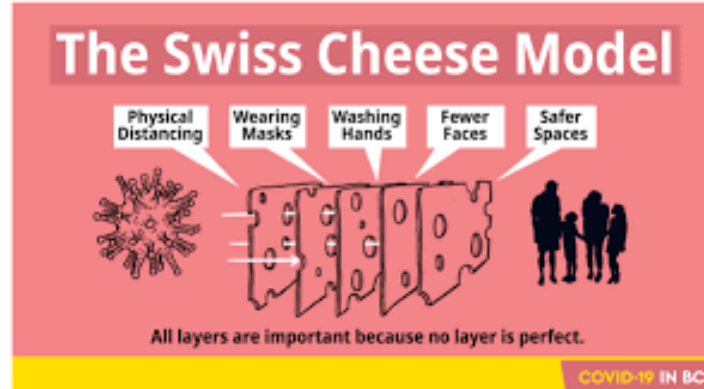
1.0 INTRODUCTION

The COVID-19 pandemic has had a very large impact on our society. Camp Jubilee has been fortunate enough to operate this summer, under provincial health guidelines. Camp Jubilee will be providing cabin rentals for families from June 25, 2021– July 30, 2021, as well as overnight summer camps in August. It is also anticipated that fall programs will include day trips and weekend overnight rentals. Our management team has developed this re-opening plan based on the order from the provincial health officer (PHO) regarding Overnight Camps for Children and Youth (June 7, 2021), as well as guidance from the BC Camping Association's (BCCA) COVID-19 Health and Safety Guidelines- Overnight Camps (June 8, 2021). We are committed to operating in a safe and secure manner, and have reviewed daily operations to ensure we can meet a high standard of customer service while following current health orders. Each area of our facility has been reviewed and we have implemented changes and closures as needed.

This season, Camp Jubilee will be operating at limited capacity to ensure health and safety of guests and staff. We will be providing personal protective equipment (PPE) as needed for all staff members. Frequent handwashing, as well as cleaning and sanitizing of all high touch areas will be completed throughout daily operations.



2.0 GENERAL PRINCIPLES



General Principles for staff, campers, and guests will include:

- Strongly encouraging members to be vaccinated for COVID-19,
- Spending as much time outdoors as possible (including meals),
- Utilizing well ventilated indoor spaces (windows and doors open to allow air circulation),
- Frequent hand hygiene,
- Physical distancing,
- Daily Health Assessments, and
- Daily temperature readings to check staff physical health.

Outdoor space principles include:

- Masks not will be required outdoors,
- Campers from different households can interact,
- Minimal physical contact between households,
- Eating within households with no spacing restrictions,
- Singing is allowed outdoors,
- High energy and group games will be limited, and
- No group size limits.

Indoor Spaces Include:

- No masks in cabins or indoor spaces within households,
- No masks in well ventilated shared indoor spaces where there is sufficient space for distancing between households,
- Masks to be worn in passenger vessels, in common spaces and with other households when distancing is not possible,
- Households can eat together indoors with 2 metre spacing between households, and
- No indoor singing.



3.0 Programs, Operations and Activities

A) MEAL TIME SERVICES

Traditionally, we offer a self-serve buffet style service. Instead, we will have Jubilee team members serving all meals from the buffet in the dining hall. Guests are welcome to return to the buffet for seconds if they wish. Staff will stand behind the buffet, two meters apart from one another when possible, and will serve guests over the buffet to allow for proper social distancing. All staff members serving food will be equipped with proper PPE for the job (masks and gloves). While in the dining hall, households will be distanced 2 meters apart with appointed tables. Guests and staff will be required to wear a mask when they are away from their designated table. Masks may be removed while sitting at their assigned table. Hosts will explain meals and how service will work.

1. Limit of total patrons will be posted at entrances and exits.
2. Entrances will be equipped with hand sanitizer. Hand washing is recommended prior to meal time.
3. All entrances and exits will be one way.
4. Floor markers will be applied to the floors of the dining hall to ensure social distancing protocols are followed.
5. All households will be situated at a table together, 2 meters apart from other households.
6. Plexiglass has been mounted on our kitchen window to act as a barrier for serving staff and kitchen staff.
7. Jubilee staff members will serve meals off the buffet line, while wearing masks and gloves.
8. All condiments will be served by Jubilee staff members.
9. Guest plates, cutlery, and cups will be placed on tables prior to meal times to avoid cross contact from other families or staff.
10. Water pitchers for each table will be refilled by the host upon request.
11. Individual salt and pepper packages can be requested from host.
12. All tables will be cleared by guests.
13. Once meal service is complete, camp staff members will remove all items from table and will clean and sanitize tables and chairs between meals.



Team Members:

1. Camp Jubilee team members will be required to wash their hands prior to entering the dining hall (lower foyer sinks) for meal service.
 2. All staff will be wearing masks and gloves to serve food to guests.
 3. Staff members will not enter the kitchen unless asked to do so by the Camp Cooks.
 4. If not assigned to serving, staff members will remain in Oceanview (dining hall for staff) until called by the host for their meal service.
 5. Camp Staff members that are assigned to serving at meal service will have an allotted meal time before or after standard meals.
 6. Staff members will sit with a maximum of 6 people per table to allow for proper social distancing. Water jugs will not be provided to staff; personal water bottles should be brought to each meal.
- ❖ Going over proper PPE procedures for meal service
 - ❖ Scheduling staff for serving
 - ❖ Ensure staff wash hands and do not enter the kitchen
 - ❖ Hosts will have to be circulating with salt and pepper and be available to fill up water jugs

B) KITCHEN OPERATIONS

Kitchen staff members will be limited to a maximum of 4 people per shift, to allow for proper social distancing and to avoid overcrowding. Kitchen staff (Cook/Assistant) will be working and program staff members will be assigned kitchen responsibilities weekly as needed. No other members of the program team will be permitted to enter the kitchen areas. There is a limit of 2 workers permitted in the special diets kitchen at any one time. When kitchen staff team members are not able to keep 2 meters of social distance, they are required to wear masks.

1. Kitchen (including Special Diets kitchen) maximum of 6 team members at any time.
2. Knives and utensils will be assigned to kitchen team members and will not be shared unless sanitized between uses.
3. All team members are required to follow social distancing measures and when not possible must be wearing masks.
4. Frequent handwashing will be practiced.
5. Bathroom facilities in the kitchen will be for kitchen staff members only and will be cleaned and sanitized thoroughly throughout working days.



6. Chefs will ensure kitchen is clean and tidy at all times and will ensure all Food Safe standards are being upheld.
7. During meal service, kitchen staff members will remain in the kitchen to prepare and serve food to food servers.

C) PROGRAM ACTIVITIES

ACTIVITIES

To ensure guest and staff health and safety, some program areas will be closed for the 2021 season. The areas that will be open are: Archery, Sling Shots, Shelter Building, Swimming, Orienteering, Team Building, Nature Hike, Beach Study and Kayaking. All instruction will occur in a socially distanced fashion. Camp Jubilee team members will ensure that all equipment is cleaned and sanitized.

1. All bows and arrows will be cleaned and sanitized daily.
2. All slingshots will be sanitized daily.
3. Ammunition for slingshots will be disposable items such as kidney beans and chickpeas.
4. All supplies for shelter building kits will be sanitized. Supplies will not be passed around to the group; they will be handled only by staff.
5. All compasses and maps will be cleaned and sanitized after use.
6. All paddles will be cleaned and sanitized using Lysol cleaner after use.
7. All boats will be cleaned and sanitized using Lysol cleaner daily.
8. PFDs will be assigned to each family on their welcome day and will not be shared.
These PFDs will be sanitized at the end of the family's stay.
9. All team building supplies will be cleaned and sanitized daily.
10. Team building equipment such as the tube, and big skies will not be used.
11. During the nature hike, staff will remain 2 meters away from guests
12. All beach study buckets will be cleaned and sanitized daily.



D) HOUSEHOLDS/ACCOMMODATIONS

GUEST ACCOMMODATIONS

Camp Jubilee has 13 Pan abode cabins, 3 yurts, 10 (2-bed) lodge rooms, and a family suite cabin. All cabins and yurts are equipped with a two piece washroom, electricity and sleeping spaces for up to 6 guests. Cabins and sleeping quarters will be assigned to households and will not be entered by staff or other patrons unless an emergency situation arises. Cabins will be used in a rotating fashion to allow a 24-hour period prior to cleaning and sanitizing.

1. Each cabin will have a maximum of 5 bunk beds (10 beds) in use.
2. Each cabin washroom will be equipped with paper towel, hand soap and hand sanitizer.
3. Cabins will be marked with family names on the door; only listed guests will be permitted access.
4. Cabins that are not in use will have closed signs and will be locked.
5. Cabins will only be entered by designated guests; staff will not clean cabins while guests are on site.
6. Cleaning supplies will be available for guests.

CAMPER HOUSEHOLDS

Campers will be divided into households to reduce the number of close contacts. A household is defined as the people campers share a sleeping space with. At Camp Jubilee, households will be limited to 10 people (no more than 9 campers and 1 staff member). These households will be their inner circle for contact tracing purposes. Higher risk activities (i.e., sleeping, dining, and indoor programming) will only be done in their household.

1. Campers/staff will sit exclusively with members of their household when dining.
2. Campers/staff will engage exclusively with members of their household when participating in indoor programming.
3. More than one household may be in an indoor program or dining facility at one time, provided windows/doors are open to ensure ventilation, all persons are adhering to occupancy limits, and different households are physically distancing from each other.
4. During meal time, campers will not have to wear a mask at their table. However, when they are away from their table masks will be required.

Outdoor activities will continue to be prioritized and interactions between households can occur providing that gathering limits are being adhered to. This includes but is not limited to outdoor socializing and outdoor activities.

Living accommodations can be shared amongst members of a single household.



1. Ventilation should be optimized by use of screen doors, screened windows, etc.
2. Cabin access will be limited to only the campers/staff who reside in that cabin (i.e., the members of that household). In the event of an emergency, if a member outside of the household needs to enter the cabin, proper PPE must be worn by the additional member.
3. Masks do not need to be worn by members of the household when in their accommodation.
4. Sleeping accommodations shared by household (the cabin) should provide 1 metre of distance between the heads of individuals. If heads cannot be 1 metre apart, temporary barriers may be used (curtains or sheets).
 - a. For Bunk Beds, position the head of the camper in the top bunk opposite the position of the camper in the bottom bunk.
 - b. For side-by-side beds, position the campers head-to-toe.
5. Where buildings have shared spaces between households (i.e., dining hall, washhouse), masks will be worn in common spaces if they do not have windows and/or doors that can be left wholly or partially open to the outdoor air.
6. Households will have designated shower times for the shared washhouse. Following the designated shower time there will be a thorough clean and disinfecting of the washhouse.

Outside of households, physical distancing should include avoiding physical contact, minimizing close and prolonged face-to-face interactions, and spreading out as much as possible within the spaces available. If campers from different households will be in the same indoor space for an extended period of time (e.g., more than 15 minutes), the space should be sufficiently large, well ventilated, and should have posted occupancy limits to prevent overcrowding between households. The number of staff interacting with each household should be minimized to the greatest extent possible. Greetings which require physical contact (high-fives, handshakes, hugs, etc.) should be avoided.

STAFF ACCOMMODATIONS

We will be housing staff in traditional spaces, with reduced occupancy. We will ensure each staff member has accommodation for their placement. We have instructed staff that personal belongings should be kept to a minimum and that all laundry must be done off site.

1. Cabins 1 & 2 will share washroom #1, cabins 3 & 4 will share washroom #2.
2. Shower facilities have been designated for staff members.
3. Laundry facilities are closed.
4. Staff cabins must be kept clean and sanitary. These spaces will be cleaned regularly by staff members who dwell in the space.
5. No staff members are to enter another staff member's cabin that has not been assigned.



6. Staff members are encouraged to socialize in outdoor spaces.
7. For Bunk Beds, staff members on the top will have their head positioned opposite to the member on the bottom.
8. For End-to-End beds, staff will sleep feet-to-feet to ensure their heads are 2 meters apart.

E) VISITORS

All visitors entering the camp will be limited to those supporting activities that are required to the benefit of the campers and required for maintenance of the camp facilities.

- All visitors will wear a mask.
- All visitors will provide confirmation (Sign in at entry, contact information etc.).
- Camp will document all visitors for contact tracing purposes.
- All visitors will complete a health assessment before arriving at camp.



4.0 Health and Safety

a) First-Aid Attendant

A First-Aid attendant will be on site and free of other duties during the operation of camps. The attendant will wear a mask, face shield, and gloves while care is being provided. When possible, the First-Aid Attendant should guide the patient to do their own First-Aid (e.g. older camper putting their own Band-Aid). The attendant will use approved procedures, mask, gloves and eye protection for all first aid applications.

b) Illness Policies

Anyone arriving to camp will complete a self-health assessment (see appendix for summer camp health assessment). Anyone with an illness or COVID-like symptoms should not come to camp, stay home and call 811 for further instructions. Symptoms are included but not limited to:

- anyone with fever or chills, cough, loss of sense of smell or taste, difficulty breathing, sore throat, loss of appetite, extreme fatigue or tiredness, headache, body aches, nausea or vomiting, and diarrhea;
- Anyone who has traveled outside of Canada in the last 14 days;
- Anyone who has been in contact with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19;
- Anyone who has been asked to self-isolate for COVID-19.

If a camper or staff person develops a new cough, fever, chills, shortness of breath, loss of taste or smell, or other symptoms of COVID-19 during the camp session the person is to be isolated away from others and sent home as soon as possible.

c) Hand Hygiene

Campers and staff are encouraged to regularly wash their hands with soap and water to reduce the spread of illness. Everyone should practice diligent hand washing when arriving at camp, before and after eating, and before leaving. Throughout the day, guests should regularly wash their hands at our handwashing stations. Handwashing sinks are available in all cabins as well as at portable hand washing stations placed around camp.

d) Record Keeping

First-Aid incident reports will be logged on the camps electronic recording system. All self-health assessments will be kept on record for the purpose of COVID-19 contact tracing.

e) COVID-19 Immunizations



All staff and campers will be encouraged to receive a COVID-19 Immunization prior to arriving at camp, however we do not have the ability to force or confirm which staff or guests have been immunized. Children under the age of 12 are not currently eligible to receive an immunization and therefore most of our campers will not be immunized.

f) Limited Camp Capacity

Camp Jubilee will be operating in 2021 at limited guest capacity of roughly 50%.

g) Self-Health Assessments

A daily self-health assessment will be conducted by all staff and campers. These checks are designed to confirm if the person has any symptoms of COVID-19, has not travelled outside of Canada in the last 14 days or been a close contact of a confirmed case of COVID-19. Parents should complete a health check of their child one week prior to camp. A camper who develops symptoms of COVID-19 during the camp session will be isolated away from others and sent home.

e) Camper, Parent, and Staff Education

All campers, parents, and staff are required to review this document before attending camp. Prior to their attendance at camp, campers and families will receive emails detailing all required information, including the COVID-19 Re-opening plan. When at camp, campers and staff will be reminded about COVID-19 policies and regulations. Frequent reminders of social distancing, mask wearing, and hand hygiene will be provided to staff and campers.

5.0 ARRIVAL DAY PROCEDURES & TRANSPORTATION



ON ARRIVAL

Camp Jubilee guests will arrive at Cates Park in North Vancouver fifteen minutes prior to their assigned boat departure time. They will be greeted by a Jubilee team member that will welcome families and help them with parking and loading questions. This process will be expedited to ensure families are not at the park for longer than necessary. Greeters will also help to ensure that guests are aware of social distancing protocols for transportation. Families will be provided a welcome pamphlet that will outline our cleaning, social distancing and facility procedures, as well as a package of self-health declarations forms for their stay.

1. While at Cates Park, Camp Jubilee staff members will ensure guests are aware of social distancing protocols and will be reminded of frequent hand washing.
2. Greeters will be equipped with hand sanitizer.
3. Greeters will ensure guests wait for water taxi services in the park and parking lot areas, not on the dock, so as to reduce the risk of overcrowding the public wharf.
4. Pamphlets will be handed out to guests outlying expectations while on site.
5. Guests will be given self-health declarations forms for the entirety of their stay that will be collected upon departure.
 - Greeters will be trained and stay current on all cleaning and social distancing protocols and equipped with proper PPE including: mask, gloves, and hand sanitizer;
 - Greeters will have self-declaration forms to hand out to each family that will cover their family's stay for the week; and
 - Greeters will work with captains before loading onto boats to ensure that a self-health declaration form has been filled out.

DURING TRANSPORTATION

Transportation to and from Camp Jubilee will be done on either our 12 passenger or 40 passenger vessels. We will be operating our boats with guidelines such as transporting households with social distancing; sanitizing our boats in between runs, ensuring all staff and campers wear face masks, and ensuring hand sanitizer is available. Vessels will run at 50% capacity until Transport Canada COVID-19 Guidelines are altered or eased.

Prior to loading guests, captain and Cates Park greeter will ensure that self-health declaration is completed by all guests.

1. Social distancing will be maintained between households,
2. All guests are required to load and unload their own luggage; captains and greeters are not able to help with this process,
3. All passengers will be required to wear a mask during transportation, and
4. Boats will be sanitized after each guest or staff boat run. This will include using sanitizer to wipe down all seats, back rests, door handles, windows as well as the steering wheel, buttons and controls.

STAFF TRANSPORTATION



1. All staff must complete a self-health declaration prior to boarding boats, and daily throughout their shifts on-site,
2. To ensure physical distancing, one seat must be left in-between staff members during transportation,
3. Camp Jubilee will ensure captains are aware of all new protocols and provide training for captains on cleaning,
4. Staff will be required to wear a mask during transportation,
5. Boats will be stocked with cleaning supplies, and
6. Self –health assessments will be checked prior to boarding.

ARRIVAL AT CAMP JUBILEE

Guests will be unloaded at Camp Jubilee by our Transport Canada certified Captains who will work with the on-site host and camp staff. On-site hosts and counsellors will welcome guests in a safe and secure manner and bring them to our front gazebo for a welcome presentation and tour.

1. Hosts will welcome guests and remind them of frequent hand washing, social distancing, and COVID-19 protocols.
2. Hosts will remind guests of daily self-health assessments.
3. Hosts will go over heat room procedures with guests. Bags will be loaded by guests into the heat room for treatment.
4. Staff will remain socially-distanced from families during luggage loading and unloading.
5. All guests will be fitted with PFDs for their stay, which will be labeled with color coding tape to indicate which family bubble they are a part of. (These PFDs will be left to clean and sanitize for 24 hours after families have left the site).
6. Frequently touched areas in and around heat room and welcome gazebo will be cleaned and sanitized regularly.
 - Training for hosts on social distancing protocols as well as handwashing procedures.
 - Heat room door handle will be sanitized regularly.
 - Guests will load and unload personal belongings in family bubbles at allotted time slots posted on door

6.0 FACILITY AND MAINTENANCE

A) MAINTENANCE DEPARTMENT



Camp Jubilee's maintenance department will be led by one supervisor, with two program team members to assist. Daily maintenance of camp includes water samples and routine checks of facilities.

1. Tools will not be shared amongst staff members; when it is necessary to share tools, they will be cleaned and sanitized in between uses.
2. Kubota will be equipped with hand sanitizer and will be cleaned in between drivers. Keys will not be left on machinery so as to avoid unnecessary use.
3. High touch surfaces in the workshop and works yard will be cleaned and sanitized regularly.

B) PHYSICAL MARKERS AND BARRIERS

Markers and directional signs have been installed to assist campers and staff. Plexiglass barriers have been installed in the kitchen area. Dining room tables, camp fire benches and picnic tables have all been spaced to allow for social distancing. A number of signs have been posted to remind staff and campers of the guidelines or indicating limited areas.

C) CLEANING

Regular cleaning and sanitizing of high touch surfaces and objects will occur daily.

- Areas where campers and/or staff have been sick will be disinfected as soon as possible
- High contact areas such as door handles, light switches, hand rails, shared office equipment etc., will be sanitized more often, as needed.
- When cleaning, staff will use detergent and water.
- Garbage cans will be emptied daily
- Staff will wash hands after cleaning and before/after wearing gloves

D) GENERAL STANDARDS

- All washrooms have posted proper hand washing techniques.
- All washrooms have been assigned to either a family bubble or a staff cohort.
- All communal buildings have one-way entrances and exits.
- Hallways have been labeled with capacity limits and arrows to direct one-way traffic.
- All exits and entrances have sanitizer available.
- All staff team members will carry first aid kits, radio, masks as well as hand sanitizer.
- All water fountains have been closed to avoid the spread of illness.
- Staff will remain 2 metres from guests whenever possible; if they are required to be within 2 meters, masks will be worn.



- Any First Aid necessary will be provided using appropriate PPE.
- First Aid room has been expanded using an outdoor tent to allow for more room, as well as a Band-Aid and benzo wipe pick up station for guests to access at any time.

7.0 SITE RISK ASSESMENT FOR COVID-19 WORKPLACE EXPOSURE

A thorough assessment of all areas at Camp Jubilee has been completed. Areas that have been identified with a risk of exposure have precautionary measures in place. The



objective of this assessment is to determine all jobs, tasks and procedures for which potential occupational exposure to COVID-19 is anticipated and to evaluate the likelihood that such exposure would occur. We have created a workplace exposure Control Plan to mitigate risk of exposure to workers onsite. This plan will be updated as changes and communication is released from the Provincial Health Authority.

Area	Risk of Exposure	Precautionary Measures Taken
Dock	Low	This outdoor space is labeled with social distancing markers. Sanitizer will be situated on the dock for guests to use.
Heat Room	High	High Touch areas must be cleaned and sanitized frequently. One family



		bubble is permitted in the heat room at a time. Staff and guests should not be in this space at the same time. Allotted pick up times for all guests will be posted on the door and announced to all patrons.
Works Yard	Moderate	Staff entering the works yard will do so with social distancing guidelines. High touch areas will be cleaned and sanitized regularly.
Staff Village	Moderate	Reduce cabin capacities to 2 people per cabin. Washroom #1 has been outfitted with hand sanitizer and designated for use by cabins 1 & 2. Washroom #2 has been outfitted with hand sanitizer and designated for use by cabins 3 & 4. All high touch areas will be cleaned and sanitized regularly. Only designated staff members are to be in cabins as assigned.
Staff House	Moderate	Washroom has been outfitted with hand sanitizer. Only residents of the house are permitted in this building. High touch areas will be cleaned and sanitized regularly.
Basement Suite	High	Area has been closed.
Basement Living Space	High	Area has been closed.
Camper Cabins	Moderate	All washrooms outfitted with sanitizer and paper towel. Limit beds to 5 bunks (10 beds) per cabin. Staff members are not permitted to enter guest cabins. Once guests have left, a 24 hour waiting period will occur before staff will clean and sanitize spaces for next group. We will use cabins 1, 3, 6, 8, 10, 12, 14 from Monday to Wednesday and cabins 2, 4, 5, 7, 9, 11, 13, 15 for groups from Wednesday to Friday.
Fordham Hall	Moderate	Washroom has been outfitted with hand sanitizer. One family bubble will be permitted in this space per booking allotment. Cleaning supplies will be available upon request from camp host. Chemicals will not be stored in cabin.
Wash house	Moderate	This Wash House will be split into two different spaces and will be used by separate families. Family name will be identified on doors, and no other guests or staff are permitted in these spaces. Cleaning supplies will be available upon request from site host, however no cleaning will occur in these spaces by staff members while guests are on site.
Generator Room	Low	Limit of one team member in this space. High touch areas will be cleaned and sanitized daily.
Wood Shed	Low	This outdoor space will have reminders of social distancing posted on gate doors. Shared tools will be removed and can be requested from camp host. Tools will be cleaned and sanitized between uses.
Lodge	High	Area has been closed.
Dining Hall	High	Entrance and exits will be one way and labeled. Entrance will be equipped with hand sanitizer and reminders of frequent hand washing protocols. Railings of walkway will be cleaned and sanitized frequently. Dining hall capacity will be limited to 50 guests at this time. Families will be situated 6 meters apart once seated in the dining hall. Floor will be marked with social distancing reminders and all guests will be reminded during meal services. Families will be called up to the dining hall by the camp host and will be brought up one at a time. Meals will be served by masked camp staff members. Condiments will be served to guests by staff and salt and pepper will be available upon request. Water jugs will be filled by camp staff members. Communal sink will be closed at this time.
Kitchen	Moderate	Limit of 6 staff members at a time in main kitchen. 2 staff member limit in special diets kitchen. Unassigned staff members are not permitted in



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		kitchens. Staff members working in the kitchen must practice social distancing and when not able to, must be wearing masks. Utensils will be used independently when possible and will be sanitized in between uses when not. Washroom will be for kitchen assigned staff use only. High touch areas will be cleaned and sanitized regularly and thoroughly.
Program Room	High	Staff members limited to 6 members at a time in this area. High touch areas will be cleaned and sanitized regularly and thoroughly.

Staff Bathrooms	High	This space will be assigned to staff cohorts. Cleaning of area must occur after personal shower. All high touch surfaces will be cleaned and sanitized regularly.

Shelter Building	Low	All equipment will be shown to guests and only handled by staff members. Equipment will be cleaned and sanitized daily. Staff will remain socially distanced whenever possible.
Team Building	Moderate	Certain equipment pieces (tube and big skies) have been removed from the rotation as cleaning and sanitizing is too difficult. All equipment will be cleaned and sanitized daily. Staff will remain socially distanced whenever possible.
Kayaking	High	PFDs will be assigned to family members on arrival day and will be left for 24 hours after guest departure for cleaning. Kayaks/canoes will be cleaned and sanitized daily. All kayaking gear including rescue equipment, paddles and pumps will be cleaned and sanitized between uses.
Beach Study	Low	All equipment will be cleaned and sanitized daily. Staff will remain socially distanced whenever possible.
